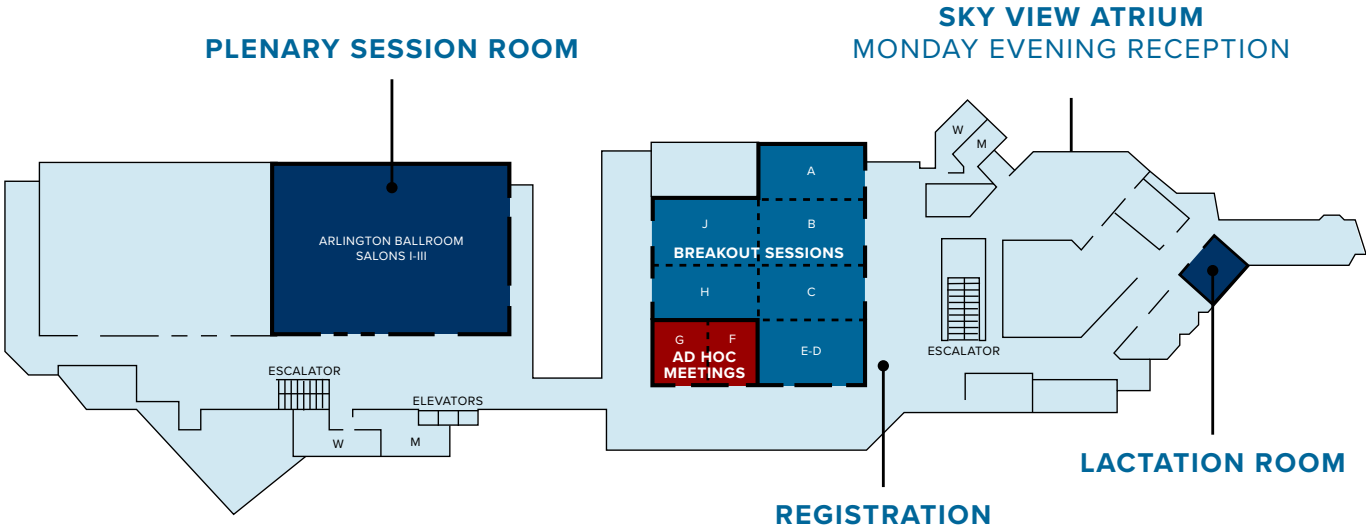
COLLABORATING ON A NEW ERA FOR MIECHV

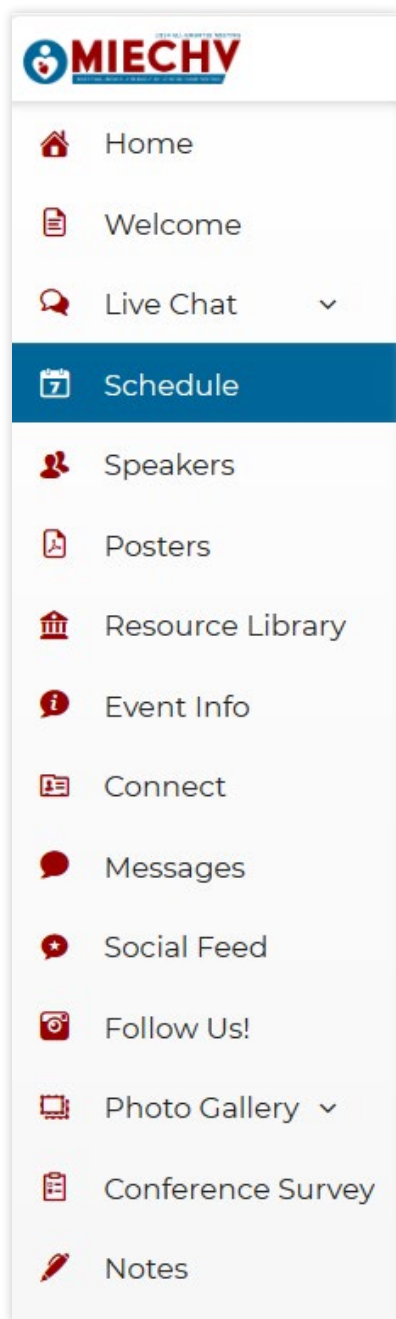

Plenary Session: Nothing for Us, Without Us: Centering Family & Community Leadership

Bryn Fortune has raised two daughters with special health needs and has the historical lived experience and expertise of a parent leader. She has over 35 years of lived experience in the role of building equity driven parent/caregiver leadership projects with deep expertise in implementation designs that address how authentic parent partnership in co-design looks when it is put into practice. Over the years her work has included local, state, and national level experiences. Previously she developed and facilitated a statewide parent leader group within Michigan's Home Visiting System, supported the Education Development Center in the production of a Parent Leadership Toolkit for HV Collaborative Improvement and Innovation Network (CollIN), lead the production of the nationally recognized publication, "Stepping Up and Speaking Out: The Evolution of Parent Leadership in Michigan" and co-produced a learning series for Start Early, "Building Parent Leadership at the Systems Level."

Currently Bryn serves as a thought partner for the National Home Visiting Network, leads the design, coordination, and facilitation for the Nurture Connection-Early Relational Health (ERH)- Family Network Collaborative (FNC) in partnership with Dr. David Willis, and provides consultation, coaching, and facilitation to various state initiatives that support their development of meaningful parent/caregiver partnership/leadership efforts.

CENTER FOR HEALTHY COMMUNITIES, MICHIGAN PUBLIC HEALTH INSTITUTE

Plenary Session: Nothing for Us, Without Us: Centering Family & Community Leadership

Julia Heany (she/her) is the Director of the Center for Healthy Communities at MPH. Her work focuses on improving family wellbeing and supporting children's development through systems change. Julia's expertise includes empowerment evaluation, community-based participatory research, and applying performance management and quality improvement methods in the context of public health and human service organizations. She leads a team focused on using community-driven processes to engage partners, assess community needs and assets, evaluate strategies, and learn and improve. Julia serves as principal investigator on several system building initiatives focused on children and families, such as Michigan's Early Childhood Comprehensive System grant, Title V needs assessment, and Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting program. Julia completed her doctorate in community psychology at the University of Missouri-Kansas City in 2005. She has two amazing children and enjoys running, paddle boarding, photography, and travel.

CAROLE JOHNSON

ADMINISTRATOR, HEALTH RESOURCES AND SERVICES
ADMINISTRATION

Plenary Session: A Conversation with HRSA Leadership

Carole Johnson is the Administrator of the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Carole Johnson joined HRSA from the White House COVID-19 Response Team. She previously served as Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Human Services, leading the state's largest agency and providing health care and social services to one-in-five New Jerseyans. During her tenure as Commissioner, the Department expanded Medicaid coverage of mental health and substance use disorder services, created new Medicaid benefits to improve maternal health outcomes, and integrated Medicaid into the newly launched state-based Affordable Care Act marketplace. Under Johnson's leadership, the Department also substantially increased child care rates for the first time in a decade, expanded food assistance benefits, and created an Office of New Americans to support the state's diverse communities. Johnson served for more than five years as the Domestic Policy Council public health lead in the Obama White House, working on the Ebola and Zika responses, implementation of the Affordable Care Act, and combatting the opioid epidemic. In addition, she served on Capitol Hill as health staff for the U.S. Senate Special Committee on Aging and for members of the U.S. Senate Finance Committee and U.S. House of Representatives Ways and Means Committee.

At the Department of Health and Human Services, Johnson previously managed health care workforce policy issues for HRSA. She also was policy director for the Alliance of Community Health Plans, program officer with the Pew Charitable Trusts health program, and senior government relations manager with the American Heart Association.

She holds a master's degree in government from the University of Virginia.

SHERRI KILLINS STEWART, EDD BUILD INITIATIVE

Plenary Session: Home Visiting and Early Childhood Systems: Accelerating, Upstream Together

Sherri Killins Stewart, Ed.D, is the Director of State Systems Alignment and Integration for the BUILD Initiative, Co-Director of State Services, and an independent consultant. Dr. Stewart works directly with state leaders to advance early childhood systems efforts in health, early learning, and family support, e.g., economic security. She leads work to define and create intentional practices regarding equity in early childhood systems, policy, programs, and leadership. Her equity work includes co-leading the Equity Leaders Action Network (ELAN), a network of early childhood leaders that aims to increase opportunity, remove barriers, and distribute resources to children, families, and communities marginalized by existing policies and practices. Dr. Stewart has worked in states, cities, and communities.

Dr. Killins Stewart has worked as a nurse home visitor, is the former Commissioner of Early Education and Care for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Vice President of Human Development and Operations at the Annie E. Casey Foundation and as CEO of Empower New Haven.

Dr. Killins Stewart is committed to supporting families, children, and adults through workforce, housing, health, and education strategies. Her efforts seek to increase access to high-quality formal and informal opportunities for families and communities. She is known for crossing organizational boundaries to create a child development and family lens on community-based work, e.g., libraries, museums, and state agencies.

Dr. Killins Stewart holds a nursing degree from the University of Pittsburgh, a Master of Administrative Science from Johns Hopkins University, and a Doctorate in Counseling Psychology from the University of Sarasota.

Tiffany Kostelec is the Manager of the Home Visiting Unit within the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. Tiffany has worked in the field of early childhood for over 20 years in both prevention and intervention focused early childhood programs, previously working as a supervisor of a Part C of IDEA program in Nevada. Tiffany's experience within the Michigan early childhood system includes working with partners to strengthen the Michigan home visiting system that includes 8 evidence-based models (e.g., NFP, HFA, PAT, EHS, MIHP, IMH, FS, PALS). Tiffany, her team, and state and local partners are collaborating in the often crazy world that is home visiting to build a system that will ensure families are supported to achieve positive outcomes. Some of our major focus areas include utilizing and strengthening the voice of parent leaders, continuous quality improvement throughout the system, addressing health equity and disparities, improving data collection and quality, expanding awareness and understanding of home visiting within communities, supporting families impacted by substance use, and coordination with the Preschool Development Grant, the Pritzker Grant, and the Families First Prevention Services Act. Tiffany and her husband live in West Michigan and have two adult children aged 23 and 20.

ANNE MOSLE

ASCEND AT THE ASPEN INSTITUTE

Plenary Session: Home Visiting and Early Childhood Systems: Accelerating, Upstream Together

Anne Mosle is a trailblazer transforming the future of leadership to elevate whole family solutions. She is Vice President at the Aspen Institute, co-founder of the Aspen Forum on Women and Girls, and founder and executive director of Ascend at the Aspen Institute—a catalyst and convener for diverse leaders working across systems and sectors to build intergenerational family prosperity and well-being by intentionally focusing on children and the adults in their lives, together. Mosle’s influence as a national leader has been recognized with numerous awards, including Distinguished Grotonian, Washingtonian of the Year, the American Public Human Services Association’s Jerry W. Friedman Health and Human Services Impact Award, and the Washington Area Women’s Foundation’s Visionary Philanthropist.

Committed to radical collaboration, Mosle created the Ascend Fellowship which to date has invested in over 140 visionary cross-sector leaders, a program that builds on her commitment to breaking down silos, advancing equity and inclusion, and valuing lived experience as expertise. Over the past decade, Mosle has ignited a global movement of hundreds of fellows, policymakers, philanthropists, researchers, parents, and practitioners focused on the same North Star: for children to grow up loved and valued, starting in their earliest years. The Ascend network reaches over 12 million families and has unlocked over \$500M in capital to build new pathways to prosperity. Mosle previously served as vice president and officer of the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and a past president of the Washington Area Women’s Foundation. She serves on the Institute for Women’s Policy Research board of directors, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation State Strategy Advisory Committee, and as a trusted advisor to countless community, public, private, and philanthropic efforts focused on intergenerational economic mobility. She lives with her family in Washington, DC.

She, too, has received national and state developed trainings in parenting and leadership. Her belief in these opportunities have led her to become a trainer for many of these opportunities that she once received. Tamara continues to be very active in her local community through volunteer and local system change work, while she maintains her membership with the state level group. Her passion for supporting families who are navigating challenges that she, too, has lived through brings a unique expertise in engaging families.

MICHAEL WARREN, MD, MPH, FAAP

Plenary Sessions: A Conversation with HRSA Leadership; Town Hall with MCHB Associate Administrator, Dr. Michael Warren

Dr. Michael Warren is the Associate Administrator of the Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB), part of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). MCHB's mission is to improve the health and well-being of America's mothers, children, and families. Its Title V Maternal and Child Health Services program serves 92% of all pregnant women, 98% of infants, and 58% of all children nationwide, including those with special health care needs.

Before assuming his current role as MCHB's Associate Administrator, Dr. Warren served in various roles at the Tennessee Department of Health, including Deputy Commissioner for Population Health, Assistant Commissioner for Family Health and Wellness, and Director of Maternal and Child Health. Prior to joining the Department of Health, he served as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at Vanderbilt and as Medical Director in the Governor's Office of Children's Care Coordination.

Dr. Warren graduated Summa Cum Laude with Honors in Psychology from Wake Forest University and earned his medical degree from the Brody School of Medicine at East Carolina University, where he was inducted into the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society. He completed his pediatrics residency, Chief Residency, and fellowship in Academic General Pediatrics at Vanderbilt, where he also obtained a Master's in Public Health. He is a board-certified pediatrician and a fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Dr. Warren has served as President of the Association of Maternal and Child Health Programs (AMCHP), the national professional organization for maternal and child health professionals. He was also appointed by the United States Department of Health and Human Services to the Secretary's Advisory Committee on Infant Mortality (SACIM).
